Patriot Properties from Toronto presented their plan to the City for apartments to be built on the Alma property. Michael Loewith, President, made a presentation at the Annual Reunion in June 2018. We were impressed with the design and particularly with the attention to remembering our Alma. A few alumnae have expressed their wish to have the facade of Alma replicated. Many others are in support of Patriot Properties proceeding with their plan based on the current design. There was an Ontario Municipal Board ruling years ago before Alma was destroyed. The majority were not in favour of a pretend Alma facade. The issue continues to be debated in St Thomas. Hopefully construction will begin this summer. Diane Silva, representative of the London Community Foundation, spoke at the June Reunion about the advantages of having our fund be within their Foundation. Donations to the Foundation means that our donors can receive tax receipts and the money will be invested. After the presentation, alumnae discussed the idea of moving the scholarship donations to LCF. It was requested that the Executive investigate the Elgin St. Thomas Community Foundation before a decision was made. The Executive made a comparison between the two funds and proceeded with transferring almost \$9,000 to LCF.

Since we gave the LCF our money last summer, we have sent out a special request to alumnae for donations. Thank you so much for your generous gifts to date. We are now at about \$17,000. We have the opportunity to provide a

\$1,000 per year scholarship, if we can raise enough funds to reach \$25,000. This scholarship amount of \$1,000 will be given out in perpetuity. What better way to have Alma remembered? Donors giving \$500 or more will receive the book "All The Girls Have Gone", a history of Alma. In the meantime, we continue to give an annual \$500 Scholarship.

# **Alma College Archives and Relics**

**Report:** Brian Masschaele, Director of Community and Cultural Services

On August 7, 2018, Brian Masschaele presented a report to County Council on the Estate Donations to Support Alma College Collections.

The report informed Council that Elgin County Archives and Elgin County Museum received bequests in the amount of \$50,000 and \$10,000 respectively to support future work relating to collections pertaining to Alma College, the former independent school for young women that operated in St. Thomas for over a century. Both the archives and museum have substantial collections relating to the college and continue to actively collect in this area. The funds will be utilized to support future projects such as digitization and preservation activities. The estate trustee is not seeking to have the source of the bequest identified, accept to say that the individuals had a long-standing association with the college.

It was recommended that the bequests in the amount of \$50,000 to Elgin County Archives and \$10,000 to Elgin County Museum be deposited into donation

accounts for each institution for use on future projects relating to Alma College.


